- Mayor Morris called the meeting to order, then Councilmember McAllister led the invocation and pledge.
- Agenda was accepted as presented.
- Councilmember McAllister made a motion to accept minutes from April 4, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Tullis, passed with all in favor.
- During department reports, Clerk Berrong presented reconciled bank balances. Public Works Director James Kimsey reported they were still locating and marking valves, patching holes, and preparing to repair a hydrant. Mayor Morris thanked councilmembers and employees for their hard work to make Cities Day a success.
- During Public Comments, County Commissioner Andrea Harper reported the county was in the process of holding budget hearings. She also reported the airport project was moving along, as well as the administration building. Also present was candidate for County Commission, Steve Lindley. Candidate for Mount Airy City Council, Patrick Ledford was also present. Mayor Morris took a moment to reflect on the recent passing of long-time resident Maggie Evans
- The next item for discussion and consideration was the intergovernmental agreement with the City of Cornelia. Councilmember McAllister made a motion to enter into said agreement. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Tullis, passed with all in favor.
- Next, Clerk Berrong presented three new business licenses for consideration, as follows:

 - All Approved Auto Sales 589 Dicks Hill Pwky, used auto sales
 - Martinez Auto Body Shop 933 Dicks Hill Pkwy, auto body repairCouncilmember McAllister made a motion to approve said business licenses. Motion was seconded by Councilmember McCoy, passed with all in favor.
- Lastly, Mayor Morris reported he had negotiated an agreement with the railroad to secure the previously discussed leases for \$750 per year. He reported that the cornerstone had been placed, and that he had received a lot of positive feedback on the museum.
